



2024 ARC Derby Summary

Do you love to race, but you don't have enough time for the traditional Air Race Classic?

Do you love cross-country flights and experiencing new places?

Are you looking for an excuse to go fly with a friend?

REGISTRATION OPENS MONDAY, AUGUST 15!

General:

- The objective is to fly a Team-designed route, abiding by the ARC Derby Rules, and be closest to your estimated flight time.
- Fly wherever you are in the world!
- Pick a day to fly your route any day between September 27 - October 6.
- Route must be flown in day VFR conditions and completed in one day.
- Teams consist of at least one woman pilot. One or more teammates can ride along!
- Limited to 99 Teams (additional Teams will be wait-listed).
- Aircraft, including light sport, experimentals, and turbo charged, must have a current annual or condition inspection.
- All team members and aircraft must comply with all FARs, or aviation regulations applicable to the entire route if in countries other than the U.S.
- Leg prizes and other prizes will be awarded.

Route:

- Route legs are defined by airports, waypoints, or lat/longs.
- Route must start and end at same location (landing not required).
- Must be 5 legs and each leg must be a minimum of 65nm each.
- Legs can cross state lines.
- Teams must land at one airport other than start/stop point.
- Each leg may have no more than one bend to avoid airspace or terrain.

Scoring:

- Teams estimate time for each leg prior to the start and submit it to the Scorer; total time will be determined by adding all leg times.
- ForeFlight, BadElf, or similar device and/or application must be used that allows .csv and limo files to be downloaded to determine time crossing each lat/long.
